

The self-reported health profiles of the district and unitary authority areas within Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland analysed by age, ethnic group, and gender: UK Census 2011

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Introduction

Using data from the UK 2011 Census, the self-reported health profiles of the district and unitary authority areas within Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland were analysed by ethnic group and gender, within four age bands. The aim of the analysis was to assess how self-reported health varied within district and unitary authority areas across the region, in terms of ethnicity, gender, and age. This information might then contribute to the targeting of further investigations into potential health inequalities for certain demographic groups in specific localities.

Each combination of gender and ethnic group in a given age band is referred to as a demographic group (e.g., White British males aged 0 to 15 years). For each district or unitary authority area, the self-reported health profile of a specified demographic group was compared to the overall self-reported health profile for the given area, within a given age band (using Fisher's Exact tests; where overall significant differences were detected ($\alpha = .05$), post-hoc tests followed in the form of analyses of standardised residuals with the Bonferroni correction applied). Using this method, it has been possible to highlight areas where certain demographic groups are overrepresented or underrepresented amongst those with "Very good or good," "Fair," or "Bad or very bad" health. The present analysis concentrates upon overrepresentations of "Very good or good" and "Bad or very bad" health for the purposes of spotting patterns in self-reported health profiles.

The findings of the analyses are presented in tables that give the self-reported health profile of each district or unitary authority area, analysed by age group, gender, and ethnicity, alongside the overall self-reported health profile for the given district or unitary authority area, in terms of percentages. The values given under “Total N” for each table represent the bases for the percentages.

Key to interpreting the tables:

	A demographic group that is significantly overrepresented in the given self-reported health category relative to the overall representation of that self-reported health category across all people (all ethnicities and genders), within the given age band and district or unitary authority area
	A demographic group that is proportionately represented in the given self-reported health category relative to the overall representation of that self-reported health category across all people (all ethnicities and genders), within the given age band and district or unitary authority area
	A demographic group that is significantly underrepresented in the given self-reported health category relative to the overall representation of that self-reported health category across all people (all ethnicities and genders), within the given age band and district or unitary authority area
	The overall representation of the given self-reported health category across all people (all ethnicities and genders), within the given age band and district or unitary authority area

Summary of findings

Compared to the overall self-reported health profile of Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland (Table 1):

- Leicester had overrepresentations of those with “Bad or very bad” health in all age groups;
- whilst self-reported health tended to be better in most other areas (Blaby, Charnwood, Harborough, Hinckley and Bosworth, Melton, Oadby and Wigston, and Rutland had overrepresentations of those with “Very good or good” health in various adult age groups; however, North West Leicestershire had no overrepresentations of “Very good or good” health in any age group).

Alongside variations in self-reported health across the district and unitary authority areas within Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland, there were also variations in self-reported health within each area, across demographic groups. Recurring patterns in the self-reported health of certain demographic groups were noted:

- Asian women were overrepresented amongst those with “Bad or very bad” health in older age groups, in Blaby (Table 2), Charnwood (Table 3), Leicester (Table 6), Melton (Table 7), and Oadby and Wigston (Table 9);
- White British men were overrepresented amongst those with “Very good or good” health in the oldest age group, in Charnwood (Table 3), Hinckley and Bosworth (Table 5), and Leicester (Table 6); although White British men (along with White British women) were overrepresented amongst those with “Bad or very bad” health amongst young adults in Leicester (Table 6);
- and White Irish males were overrepresented amongst those with “Bad or very bad” health amongst children in Charnwood (Table 3) and young adults in Rutland (Table 10).

The self-reported health profile of Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland: an overview by district and unitary authority area

Compared to the overall self-reported health profile of Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland for each age group (Table 1):

- Leicester had overrepresentations of those with “Bad or very bad” health in all age groups (0 to 15 years, 16 to 49 years, 50 to 64 years, and 65 years and over);
- Blaby, Charnwood, and Harborough had overrepresentations of those with “Very good or good” health amongst all adult age groups (16 to 49 years, 50 to 64 years, and 65 years and over);
- Hinckley and Bosworth, Oadby and Wigston, and Rutland had overrepresentations of those with “Very good or good” health amongst older adult age groups (50 to 64 years, and 65 years and over);
- North West Leicestershire largely followed the overall profile for Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland, but without the overrepresentations of those with “Very good or good” health that were seen for other areas in Leicestershire and Rutland, and with an underrepresentation of those with “Very good or good” health amongst the oldest adults (65 years and over).

The self-reported health profile of Blaby by gender and ethnic group

Compared to the overall self-reported health profile of Blaby within each age group (Table 2):

- Asian women were overrepresented amongst those with “Bad or very bad” health in the older age groups (50 to 64 years and 65 years and over);
- Women from “Other” White ethnic groups were overrepresented amongst those with “Bad or very bad” health in the oldest age group (65 years and over).

The self-reported health profile of Charnwood by gender and ethnic group

Compared to the overall self-reported health profile of Charnwood within each age group (Table 3):

- White British men were overrepresented amongst those with “Very good or good” health in the oldest age group (65 years and over);
- White Irish males were overrepresented amongst those with “Bad or very bad” health in the youngest age group (0 to 15 years);
- Asian women were overrepresented amongst those with “Bad or very bad” health in the older age groups (50 to 64 years and 65 years and over).

Compared to the overall self-reported health profile of Harborough within each age group (Table 4):

- the health profiles of all gender and ethnicity groups were distributed proportionately across each health category.

The self-reported health profile of Hinckley and Bosworth by gender and ethnic group

Compared to the overall self-reported health profile of Hinckley and Bosworth within each age group (Table 5):

- White British men were overrepresented amongst those with “Very good or good” health in the oldest age group (65 years and over);
- Asian women were overrepresented amongst those with “Bad or very bad” health in the oldest age group (65 years and over).

The self-reported health profile of Leicester by gender and ethnic group

Compared to the overall self-reported health profile of Leicester within each age group (Table 6):

- White British men and women were overrepresented amongst those with “Bad or very bad” health amongst young adults (16 to 49 years), but White British men were overrepresented amongst those with “Very good or good” health in the oldest age group (65 years and over);
- Men and women from “Other” White ethnic groups and Asian Men were overrepresented amongst those with “Very good or good” health in the younger adult age group (16 to 49 years);
- Black British men and White British women were overrepresented amongst those with “Very good or good” health in the older adult age group (50 to 64 years);
- Asian women were overrepresented amongst those with “Bad or very bad” health in the older age groups (50 to 64, 65 years and over).
