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Introducing our newest member of the R&D Team...


WELCOME TO THE TEAM, KARISHMA!

I have recently submitted my PhD thesis at the University of Leicester in the Department of Neuroscience, Psychology and Behaviour. My research investigated the molecular mechanisms regulating how the cells in your brain, your neurons, are connected to each other.

I enjoy research because it allows you to understand the nuts and bolts of how a particular disease or illness works, and using that information to provide the best quality of care.

I am really excited to be supporting the clinical research happening throughout LPT in this role, where research is making a real difference to peoples' lives!



Be Part Of Coronavirus Research

Vaccines can prevent you from getting very serious infectious diseases, such as COVID-19.

Vaccines work by giving you a tiny amount of the disease causing pathogen; this won't make you ill but will allow your body to generate an immune response by making antibodies.

If you were ever infected with the real disease causing pathogen, rather than getting really sick, your body is primed to attack. You are immune to the disease. Having a vaccination doesn't just protect you against a disease; it can help to curb the spread of the disease.

Eventually, this can mean that a disease disappears altogether!

Before a vaccine is available to the general public, important research needs to be carried out to ensure the vaccine is both safe and effective.

Right now there are research studies taking place to make sure any potential COVID-19 vaccinations are safe. In England these studies are being carried out by the NHS and the National Institute for Health Research (NIHR).






If you chose to take part, you would be:

- Contacted by researchers working on NIHR approved studies.
- You would visit the research site a few times over 6 or 12 months where you may or may not be offered a COVID-19 vaccine.
- Here you will be told about the study, what it involves and have the opportunity to ask any questions.
- You may also be asked to have a blood test or take nose swabs.

This research is essential for us to produce a safe vaccine to beat COVID-19.

WHAT ARE YOUR VIEWS ON CORONAVIRUS RESEARCH?

Researchers want to find out more about people's attitudes towards COVID-19 vaccine research - and they need your help.

The NIHR Clinical Research Network East Midlands, Centre for Black and Minority Ethnic Health and the University of Leicester have teamed up to create a short survey to understand more about attitudes towards vaccine research.



Participants are asked to answer a series of questions online to help researchers understand more about the potential barriers to participation in vaccine research, and to explore how attitudes might vary across different groups.

The findings will be used by researchers to ensure that COVID-19 vaccine trials are accessible, and that participants are provided with the support and information that they need.

The SIREN study (Sarscov2 Immunity & Reinfection EvaluatioN) is a national study run by Public Health England to investigate whether the presence of antibodies protects staff against the virus or not, and if it does, how long it lasts.

To take part you need to be able to say 'Yes' to all of the following:

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- Are you a staff member who works in a clinical setting where patients are present?
- Do you intend to remain engaged with follow-up (12 months), even if you move to another NHS site?
- Can you provide consent to your participation in this study? (this will be done online)

We are particularly interested in recruiting people who have a positive antibody test result.


