Learning Disabilities, LLR annual reports

- The annual report

Purpose of the report

- This paper contains 3 documents that have been published by the LLR Transforming Care Programme, our annual report for 20/21, the LLR Learning from Learning Disability deaths in LLR and an easy read version of the learning from the deaths of service users with a learning disability.

Analysis of the issue

- In March 2020, LPT stepped into the LLR strategic leadership of the Transforming Care Programme. At that time we were considered to be a poorly performing system. LPT have supported additional actions and the annual report notes:
 - We now have less people in hospital than we did 12 months ago, this is also our lowest number of in-patients for at least 4 years.
 - We have achieved the Annual Health Check Indicator for the first time, supporting people with a learning disability or autism to have access to an annual review to promote well-being and prevent ill-health.
 - We have reviewed all deaths of service users in LLR within 6 months of their death; unless additional processes e.g. coroner's enquiry have prevented us from achieving this. This is the first time we have achieved this indicator.
 - We have introduced new services and some of these will be shared in the public board today.
 - We have been deescalated from regional NHS E/I escalation because our performance has improved significantly.
 - We have a 3 year plan for our future, investment from NHS England/Improvement and we have developed that plan in partnership with service users and carers. Our NHS England feedback on our plan was:
"The Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland System submitted a really positive plan which was robust and deliverable. The plan was articulated well and extremely well presented with clear conviction around the plans that will be delivered over the next 3 years. It was positive to note the recognition of the importance of coproduction and collaboration at all levels of planning as well as having a strong strategic vision. It is very encouraging to see the commitment to reducing health inequalities and your ongoing plans to improve the lives and outcomes for your autistic population and those with learning disabilities."
- Our LLR annual report is supplemented by an easy read version, to support service users and their families understand the work we are doing and its importance. Across LLR we are sharing this with NHS and local authority connected organisations. To support improvements in health and care for our population we have created a checklist to remind professionals of the key

things to remember when working with service users with a learning disability. The key focus is on listening to what people say, record accurately and making no assumptions.

Proposal

- These documents provide LPT's Board with a summary of the changes we have facilitated in LLR over the last 12 months, they also provide useful information for everyone working in health and care across LLR about how to improve practice.

Decision required

 - The progress made over the last 12 months
 - Support the LPT Directors who will cascade these documents and share these will colleagues across LPT to support improvements in practice.
 - LPT will support other organisations to publish and share these documents in order to improve services elsewhere in LLR.
