Achievements and Barriers				

List the top three achievements or successes for the committee

- The charity has received unprecedented levels of donations in 2020/21, including £295k from NHS Charities Together (NHSCT). The funding has been allocated to support both staff & patient health & wellbeing initiatives. A significant sum - £106k has been allocated to improve over 100 staff rooms across the Trust. The committee and trustees have contributed to the LLR system's bid for £490k from NHSCT's community award. The committee and its trustees have maintained oversight of all donations received and ensured that spending plans are in accordance with donor's wishes and that we followed best practice around acceptance and management of donations.
- The committee has overseen delivery against the charity's 2020/21 four objectives:
 - Visibility Increase the charity brand awareness and profile to all relevant audiences
 - Income Increase the level of donations to the charity using the appropriate fundraising mix
 - Grants Invest in initiatives that support the vision of the charity
 - Partnerships Develop partnerships which increase the reach and impact of the charity.
- The committee's governance structure has been maintained, relevant policies & procedures have



been reviewed and approved, and the committee has continued to meet throughout the year. We also held additional meetings between committee dates to ensure that urgent covid business could be discussed and actions taken to maintain momentum and delivery of Raising Health's priorities.

Future Plans

What are the Committee's key priorities; focus and planned developments for next year?

The committee will continue to focus on the delivery of the Charity's four objectives, which have been reviewed and will remain the same as the 2020/21 objectives. The specific deliverables will be updated for 2021/22.

The committee will continue to focus on financial sustainability. While the level of income for 2020/21 was exceptional, we can expect it to return to normal levels this year and so must ensure the underlying position is understood and managed appropriately.

We will continue to work with external partners including Carlton Hayes Charity, NHSCT, system partners, private sector networking groups and grant givers to progress the work of the charity.
