Some people will need someone to help them to go through this information so that they understand it. This person may be a member of staff, someone from your family or a friend.



We are an NHS team that helps people over the age of 18 with a learning disability who may have been in trouble with the police or court.



We will help you if:



- you are doing things that break the law and might mean:
 - you are arrested,
 - have to go to court
 - may go to prison



- sex offending, which means doing something sexual to another person that they do not want
- hurting other people
- setting fire to things





We will help you if:

- you have been in a secure hospital or been to prison because you have broken the law.
- we can help you settle back into the community and try to make sure you do not break the law again.

What we do



When we meet you we will say:

- · what our name is
- · what our job is



We will use assessments to find out more about you and how we can help.



If you are in a secure hospital or prison we will help you leave by:

- · helping to find the right place to live
- planning how to keep everyone safe
- giving support after the move

Working with you



We will work with other people to support you. This could include your:

- · family/friends
- carer
- doctor
- · hospital
- · social worker
- other people in the learning disability team



We will make a plan together about how to help you.
