You would be working under the supervision of the ward team and will report to the nurse in charge. You will undertake a range of housekeeping and runner activities, such as keeping patients' company, helping them to call home, collecting items from pharmacy and stores, supporting housekeeping staff keeping ward store cupboards stocked, answering the ward phone, and dealing with general queries. You may also assist the ward housekeeping team to serve meals and clearing away at the end of service.

Successful candidates would need to undertake some paid core mandatory training, a face-to-face induction, and a session on the ward for familiarisation prior to deployment.

The application process will involve an interview and to ensure suitability for the role and we will require 3 years of references and other employment checks.
