Early Sound Play

Some children have difficulty learning and using speech sounds correctly. The activities in this leaflet will:

- Help your child listen to speech sounds
- Allow you and your child to have fun playing with new speech sounds

When carrying out the activities with your child::

- Repeat the sounds lots of times
- **<u>Do not</u>** expect your child to copy you. It is the adult who is making the sounds, not the child
- Remember to say the sound not the letter (e.g. 'sss' not 'suh')
- Encourage your child to look at your face and listen to you when you say the sounds
- Make sure your child can see your lips and tongue making the speech sounds
- Talk about using your lips and tongue when making the sounds
- Make the activities fun!

Responding to your child:

Your child may join in with making the sounds when they are ready, but must never be asked to do so. If your child feels under pressure to make the sounds, it is likely to put them off and may make further speech therapy more difficult.

- If your child has a go at making the sound in the right way, give them praise and tell them what they have done well (e.g. 'well done, I saw your tongue make that sound')
- If your child has a go at making the sound but says it incorrectly, do not correct them- instead ask them to keep listening to you making the sounds (e.g. 'keep listening to me, the dripping tap says t-t-t')

Activities

Use a tub of bubbles, blow and catch one on the wand. Put the bubble close to your mouth and wobble it by whispering 'p-p-p'	Bounce a ball and say 'b-b-b' (you can bounce the ball into a box, in a bag or to each other)
	Blow up a balloon and bat it to each other; say a /b/
At bath time, put lots of bubbles on your hand and then blow them with a 'p' sound	sound as you bat it into the air Make a 'b-b-b' sound when jumping on a trampoline
Whisper a 'p' sound on to your child's face, hand, tummy etc. Let them feel the air and see your lips make the 'p' sound	
Steam up a mirror by whispering a 'p' sound

Watch the cold tap dripping at bath time- whisper 't-t-t' as it drips	Play with a drum or a pan/wooden spoon and say 'd-d-d' as you hit it
